**1. TAD OPPORTUNITIES:**

**a. Detainee Operations:** Three O3 JAGs needed to report NLT 15 August for a 179-day TAD in Iraq to support Multi-National Force Iraq (MNF-I). Interested officers should contact LCDR Jim Protin.

**b. Afghanistan Ministry of Defense:** O5/O4 JAG (male) to relieve CDR Chris Jung, supporting the Afghan National Army CFC-Afghanistan CJTF 180. The officer must hold a secret clearance and be available to report in late September for 179 days. The position is designed to assist in the development of the legal department in the Afghanistan Ministry of Defense (MOD) and to act as the primary contact with MOD legal staff. The selected officer will also mentor and provide necessary legal support as well as providing the necessary legal expertise in staffing and dividing specific areas of duties within the newly created legal division of the MOD. Interested officers should contact CAPT Frank Carber.

**c. Regime Crimes Liaison Office (RCLO):** O5 JAG to relieve CDR Jack McDonald, reporting in late September. The RCLO was created to advise and assist the Iraqi Special Tribunal in the investigation and prosecution of the former regime and Ba'ath party leaders. The office is headed by a Presidential appointee and the staff is made up of Justice Department attorneys, investigators and administrative staff, service judge advocates, military operations officers and other international investigators and staff. The office is based at the American Embassy in Baghdad but the assigned officer may need to travel throughout Iraq and other countries in carrying out assigned duties. This assignment requires the officer to go through equipment issue and weapons qualification before reporting to Baghdad and the officer must have a secret clearance or higher. **d. Central Criminal Court of Iraq:** Three O3 JAGs to relieve LTs Wexler, Maye, and Richman, reporting in September. The officers will assist Multi-National Force Iraq's (MNF-I) continuing efforts in supporting investigative and prosecution teams for the Central Criminal Court of Iraq, an Iraqi run judicial forum exclusively using Iraqi judges, laws and procedures. As investigative team leaders, JAGs will be forward deployed to the various Major Support Commands (MSC) in order to directly support investigations of attacks against Coalition Forces and to facilitate prosecution at the Central Criminal Court. Some JAGs will be based in Baghdad to review cases from the field teams, arrange for witness transportation, prepare cases for prosecution and present these cases to the Central Criminal Court of Iraq through verdict and appeal. Currently there are hundreds of cases in the prosecution cycle. All positions require extensive leadership skills, and a willingness to work independently in an oftentimes austere work environment. Previous experience in joint-operations is a plus. Interested officers should contact LCDR Jim Protin.
